A Tough Decision: Elevate or Relocate?

For many of us, climate change is something we read about in the news. It doesn't seem to affect our daily lives much. For the residents of the Marshall Islands, however, climate change isn't some future danger. It's impacting their lives right now.

Water and air temperatures are increasing worldwide. As the water in the ocean becomes warmer, it expands, so that there is even more water. In addition, warmer air is rapidly melting the land ice in cold places like Greenland and the Arctic, which adds more water to the seas. Both of these factors are contributing to sea level rise. For low-lying island places like the Marshall Islands, more water means more trouble.

At only ten feet (three meters) above sea level, the capital of the Marshal Islands will be at risk. With a higher sea level in the future, floods will be more frequent and cover more ground. These floods will bring salty water inland. The salt will damage the infrastructure and pollute the groundwater that the residents rely on for drinking water. Many people believe that this will make the Marshall Islands unlivable in the future.

The Marshallese are starting to adapt to the new reality of rising seas. They are considering a couple of different options to solve the problem. One idea is to construct a new island home for approximately 60,000 islanders and they would relocate to it. Another idea is for the islanders to remain where they are now and elevate all of the island's buildings through construction.

Both of these expensive proposals face major obstacles. First, there's the question of money: how will the construction costs be paid for? Second, people have lived in this area for thousands of years. What will happen to the local culture and traditions if everyone has to abandon their home and go elsewhere?

The Marshallese are facing some difficult decisions. What will they protect? What will they abandon? How will they face the danger of rising seas?
